Who is eligible?

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- ▶ The proposed project must take place in one of the fifty states or Washington, D.C.
- ▶ The applicant must be a teacher or service-learning coordinator at a public, private, faith-based, or charter school; or
 - an instructor or service-learning coordinator at an institution of higher education; or
 - student(s) in the health professions; or
 - staff at a community-based non-profit organization.

361 groups across the country were heroes in 2009 and 2010. This is your opportunity to submit creative projects to help kids live healthier lives and be part of Global Youth Service Day 2011.

Please secure approval from your principal or other appropriate institutional leadership before submitting your project proposal.

Visit www.YSA.org/HEROES to apply. Applications must be submitted online by midnight ET on Oct. 22, 2010.

Review process

Successful applicants will design and implement a service-learning project that addresses issues relating to childhood obesity. Projects most likely to be funded will be those that:

- ▶ Use public data on obesity to demonstrate the need for the project in your school or community.
- ▶ Respect the physical and emotional characteristics of the issue.
- ▶ Are replicable and/or can be scaled up.
- ▶ Produce measurable results.

We encourage projects where youth work with teachers and adults, but remember this is an opportunity for youth to shine.

May 2011: Online project evaluations are due.
